

RECOMMENDED ITEMS

- Soft rag, duster or vacuum with soft nozzle
- Clean cloth for washing
- Mild detergent or dish soap
- Bucket or spray bottle for cleaning mixture
- Distilled white vinegar
- Clean, soft cloth for drying
- Squeegee for doors with glass

INSTRUCTIONS

Gently dust the door with either a soft rag, duster or vacuum that has a soft nozzle attachment. A quick weekly dusting helps your doors maintain their fresh, like new finish.

For basic cleaning, mix a few drops of mild dish soap with warm water and wipe with a clean, soft cloth from top to bottom. Do not use strong cleaning solutions or abrasive cleaners.

Exercise special care when cleaning coated glass surfaces. Avoid cleaning coated glass surfaces in direct sunlight.

Do not use scrapers of any size for cleaning glass. Be careful not to trap abrasive particles between the cleaning materials and the glass surface.

For hard to clean areas or areas with mold, mix equal parts vinegar and water and use a soft, clean cloth, still working from top down. Be sure to test on an inconspicuous part of the door first.

A clean rinse should follow immediately, being sure to get rid of any soap residue. If the door has glass, you can use a squeegee to remove all the cleaning residue.

Dry the door with a clean, soft cloth to prevent water spots or streaks. Do not use blown air as it may cause spotting.
